During November we also had a setback: due to a prolonged respiratory infection Hwee Ping had to return to Singapore for medical attention. Thank God that she is back on the field now but please continue to stand with us in prayer for her **complete healing**.

Missions Mobilization (Tim)

Internationally: "It's good to be back on the field after 4 weeks of meetings across England, Wales and Ireland. The final weekend was a very special time: I spoke at a Missions Conference of a church in Northern Ireland whose Pastor (also called Tim) was my classmate in Bible College—we had not seen each other since 1993! **Pray for the follow up** of the dozens of folks who responded to the call to move into mission."

Locally: Tim continues to challenge Cambodian churches and pastors to catch the vision of reaching out the unreached at their doorstep. He is also currently working on the proposal for a new ministry.

On **11 December** the Santos family returns to Australia. Please pray as they farewell friends here, and pray for a good re-entry to Australia.

During their absence the leaders and members of **Hope Church** will receive pastoral care from our friends from World Team while the outreach to K'pon will continue with assistance from KEC, a local denomination.

Dani's father has died, and she collapsed. She is exhausted after 2 months of constantly nursing him. Pray for God to encourage her (Luis has just given her a Bible, which she was grateful for) and for her family to finally be more supportive of her.

Vocational Training Programme

We will **celebrate the "first fruits"** of VTP on Dec 11: the first 3 trainees who successfully completed the entire 2-year training in DSD (metal fabrication workshop) will graduate. Pray they will find good employment & apply what they have learnt from their good role models & God's Word.

We are sad that **Chhaya** and the DSD workshop team will leave us by the end of this year. Lift him up, as he believes this is the will of the Lord, yet he knows that this way will not be easy. Pray we will be able to work out an exit plan that brings honour to God and blessing to both WEC and DSD/Chhaya.

A young church which has a vision for "Christian Community Enrichment" **approached us to support their one-year-old restaurant**. Their vision fits very well with ours and they also fulfill the conditions for VTP membership. We are praying and considering adopting this group into VTP. Our worries are mainly our limited training capacity and resources.

Bridge of Hope (Valeria, Christine)

We thank God for a smooth winding down of the Bridge programme in Phnom Penh. The families had a good time during the farewell outing, visiting a local "zoo" and going for a swim.

Half of our Khmer staff still needs to find new jobs: please pray with us for Chariya, Kompeak and Ming Seth.

We realize that there is a spiritual battle going on as we want to move on—please ask God for His protection over us and the work, and His guidance and discernment to set up new well in Siem Reap.

May He grant us favor in contacts with local authorities and working in people's hearts there so that they would be hungry for Him.
